BOARD MEMBERS

Andrew Courtney was a career teacher of Fine Arts at Woodlands H.S. His work there began in the vigorous civil rights era. For him, Woodlands High School was a vital base for the adventure of learning in and out of the classroom. Special examples of this adventure were Andrew's authoring of the experimental EVOLVE program of 1971, the Square Block Project of 1977 and the China trip of 1982. He saw these as art projects. His early and continued participation with the W.I.S.E. program was form fitted to his philosophy of experiential education. Andrew is an activist for social issues and an exhibition documentary photographer/ filmmaker.

Steven Brown is the President of the Greyston Foundation. Steven has been a member of Greyston's Board since 1998. Steven has a long history with WISE, participating on its first Task Force at Woodlands High School, and in the first class of WISE in 1973, where he did a project in journalism. He is currently the Chair of the Wise Services Board and is the proud parent of Anya, who is a White Plains HS WISE student.

Michael Mark is a musician/composer by profession. He serves on the Nyack School Board and the Board of the Valley Cottage Library. A WISE FAMILY - BY SUSAN SOMERSILLE REGGIE



My mother, Valerie Somersille, was on the original Task Force that started the WISE program at Woodlands High School in 1972-73. As the Executive Director of Westchester Community Opportunity Program, Inc., and later Director of the New York State Division of Economic Opportunity, she saw the need for structured, supportive transition projects for high school seniors.

Ten years later, in 1983, I did my WISE project in animal behavior with Toni Abramson as my mentor. My WISE experience helped me rule out veterinary medicine as a career, saving years of schooling. I went on to earn a B.S. in engineering at Harvard University, and an MBA at The Wharton School. In 1994, while working for Apple Computer in San Francisco, I helped WISE Services start the program at Berkeley High School.

Having my mother as a founding board member of WISE Services was an indispensable source of inspiration and support. It was always great to hear from her, Toni, Vic Leviatin, and my classmates about all the students benefiting from this extraordinary program, as WISE continued to expand across the country. When I moved back to New York in 2000, although Mom's health was declining, she never wavered in her support for WISE and continued to be an active WISE board member while also serving on the Westchester Community College Board of Trustees and the Westchester Community College Foundation.

My mother died on January 29, 2004. Her strong voice for justice, her wit and perseverance are sorely missed but are manifest each day in the quality of services that WISE provides.

This summer, I was asked to become a Director on the WISE Services Board, which has five WISE graduates as Directors on the 14-member board. In spite of a grueling schedule as the Director of Product Management at Dictaphone, I was honored to be asked and eager to accept, because I also knew my mother wouldn't have it any other way. I am proud to continue the Somersille tradition of service to WISE as we help adolescents pursue their passions and find their way to making a contribution to the world.
